The apparatus include 3 Engines, 2 Rescue Squads and 2 Brush Rigs.

- Engine #1: 1975 C8000 FORD, Diesel Powered, PEIRCE Pumper with a 1000 GPM pump and a 750 water tank.
- Engine #2: 1982 OSHKOSH, Deisel Powered, PEIRCE Pumper\Tanker with a 1250 GPM pump and a 2000 gallon water tank.
- Engine #4: 1987 SPARTAN, Deisel Powered, FMC Pumper with a 1500 GPM pump and a 1000 gallon water tank.
- Rescue #5: 1978 FORD, PEIRCE Attack-Pumper\Rescue Unit with a 400 GPM pump and a 500 gallon water tank. Features complete rescue equipment and emergency medical equipment.
- Rescue #7: 1987 FORD 1 Ton 4 Wheel Drive with a WARNER Utility Body. Features complete rescue equipment and emergency medical equipment.
- Brush #3: 1988 TOYOTA 4 Wheel Drive with a 90 gallon water tank and a MARCO self-contained pumping unit.
- Brush #6: 1977 FORD 4 Wheel Drive with a 200 gallon water tank and a 60 GPM DARLEY self-contained pumping unit.

The Perry Township Fire Department has contracts to provide fire and medical assistance to Perry and Union Township. The fire department has mutual aid agreements to assist or be assisted by German, Marrs, Knight, Scott, McCutchanville and Evansville Fire Departments.

The fire departments command structure consists of; 1- chief, 2- assistant chiefs, 4- district chiefs, 1- deputy chief and 1- medical captain. Including these officers there are 36 active members on the fire department.

The administration of the fire department consists of a 9 member board of directors. The officers consist of a president, vice-president, secretary and treasure.

The fire department operates seven apparatus out of two stations. Station #1 is located at 1506 Johnson Lane off of Broadway. It houses Engine 1, Engine 2, Brush 3, and Rescue 7. Station #2 is located at 11 Williams Road off of Hogue Road. It houses Engine 4, Rescue 5 and Brush 6.
