RECREATIONAL FIRES

What is legal?

It is summer time and people are out, and people are also burning recreational fires! Do you know the burning laws for Vanderburgh County? Local burning regulations (from the Evansville Municipal Code, 16.05.200) states: "All recreational fires require advance approval from the EEPA office during normal business hours (M-F, 8am-5pm), while use of outdoor cooking grills, stationary (built-in) patio fire pits, and portable patio fire bowls are not currently regulated and do NOT require advanced approval." Our department is usually called when fires are left unattended, become too large, produce a large amount of smoke, and when subjects are burning trash.

A few things to remember when burning:

- Only burn clean, untreated wood or charcoal
- Only one fire is allowed at a time
- The fire should never be left unattended at any time
- Adequate fire protection, such as water hoses and other extinguishing products, should be present and within reach in case of emergency.

Please stay safe while burning and take all necessary precautions

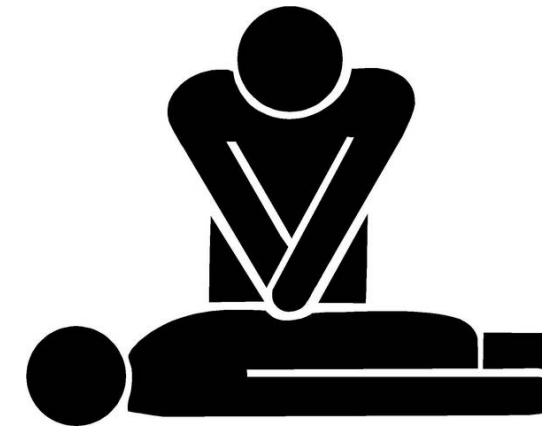

Perry Township Dive Rescue Team: NEW ADDITION!

Many residents of Perry Township enjoy spending time on the various bodies of water found locally, such as lakes, ponds, and the Ohio River. When things go wrong on the water, we are there for you, covering all bodies of water within Perry Township, and 20 miles of the Ohio River in Union Township. Danger and disaster occur when you are least prepared, but we are always at the ready to respond at a moment's notice to a multitude of surface and subsurface water rescue incidents, including: boaters in distress, sinking vessels, victims in the water, cars in the water, flood water response, swift water rescue, and evidence recovery.

Perry Township is privileged to have a great working relationship with our neighboring agencies, who we assist, and who assist us when incidents require more equipment and manpower than just one department can provide. Prior to 2014, all of the department's dive rescue equipment was located on Rescue 7, which makes the vast majority of our emergency responses. This takes a toll on our equipment by riding around in all types of weather. Near the end of 2014, we began the process of building a water rescue team trailer in order to move the dive equipment and our zodiac swift water boat into one vehicle for easy deployment and protection from the elements. The water rescue trailer is housed at Station 1 on Johnson Lane, and will only be deployed for water rescue runs and training. The trailer has been a work in progress since the late fall, and all of the labor poured into this project was donated time by members of our department. This has been a labor of love, and we will continue to evaluate the trailer as we respond to incidents to determine if any storage and efficiency questions come up and how to fix them.
